

THE **INACCURACIES** OF POLITICAL RESEARCH DATA

1 - COMPARING TOO BIG OF AN AREA

Comparisons for Political purposes regarding Crime, Poverty, Economics, and Healthcare can be highly inaccurate as the differences between Big Cities and Suburbs can be significant. In fact, larger area comparisons, like State-by-State, are also highly inaccurate as a single city can easily skew the entire state's numbers. State-by-State comparisons are just too big of a geographical area to use as even the suburbs can easily make bad cities look good, from a statewide view.

2 - SOCIAL CARROT POLICIES (HAND OUTS)

Some states and cities have enabling Social Carrot policies (Hand Outs) that attract the Irresponsible Poor, Homeless, Criminals, and Drug Addicts all of which easily skew state and city statistics and political comparisons.
